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#### Introduction

- Graduating from pharmacy school is a momentous occasion.

### Background.....

- Traditionally, pharmacy was regarded as a transitional discipline between the health and chemical sciences and as a profession charged with ensuring the safe use of medication.
- In the early 1900s, pharmacists fulfilled the role of apothecary preparing drug products *secundum artem* (according to the art) for medicinal use.
- By the mid-1960s pharmacists had evolved toward a more patientoriented practice and developed the concept of clinical pharmacy.

### Background contd.

- The clinical pharmacy era marked the beginning of a period of rapid transition that was characterized by an expansion and integration of professional functions, as well as increased professional diversity and closer interaction with physicians and other health care professionals.
- By the early 1990s, the pharmaceutical care model was adopted to emphasize that the role of the pharmacist involves "the responsible provision of drug therapy for the purpose of achieving definite outcomes that improve a patient's quality of life." (Pharmaceutical care)

### Background.

- Pharmacists are currently recognized as drug experts
- Major role: working in collaboration with patients, physicians and other health care professionals.
- Goal: Optimization of medication management
- Producing positive health outcomes.




## The many faces of the profession



### The star pharmacist

- "Seven-star pharmacist
  - Introduced by the WHO, and adopted by the FIP in 2000 in its policy statement on Good Pharmacy Education Practice
    - To cover the roles of caregiver, decision-maker, communicator, manager, life-long learner, teacher and leader.
- Eight-star pharmacist
  - Researcher has since been added.
  - All these have been addressed in the competence standards.

#### The transition

- The common challenges of transitioning to professional life are felt by pharmacy graduates around the world.
- Prior to practice, the student will rarely be granted full autonomy, and decisions taken are often supported in an academic framework.
- In practice, however, the new pharmacist faces complex decision making, (sometimes without the guiding hand of a preceptor), has more responsibility, and is expected to be politely assertive when a potential drug therapy issue is identified.

### The transition contd.

- To overcome this hurdle
  - Mentally accept your new role as a pharmacist
  - Be prepared to fully embrace the responsibilities that come with it.
  - Visualize yourself as an active part of the health care system, (or any pharmacy-related practice).
  - Always act in the best interest of the patient, society, and the country at large
  - Utilize soft skills such as critical thinking and emotional intelligence

Hard skills: Tangible, easy to teach, identify, and measure, e.g. technical and administrative skills.


Soft skills: intangible, interpersonal, and immeasurable, e.g. communication, empathy, and negotiation.


